## 4 Welfare Course

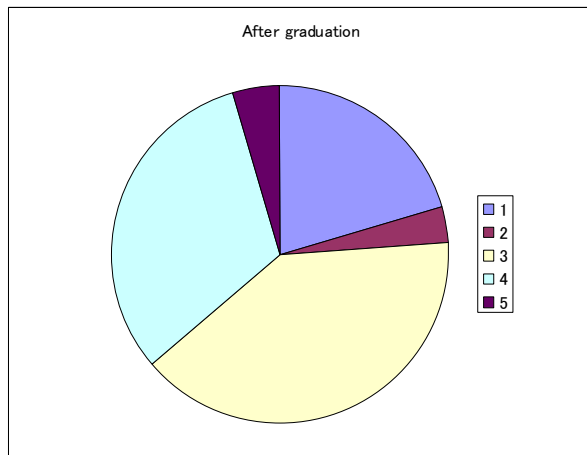
### (1) Identity and Objective

## 8 Access to School (Public Transportation)

### (1) From Hiroshima Station

You can take 'Sanyo Line' of Japan Railway (heading east-bound) at Hiroshima Station, and get off at Saijo Station. It takes about 35 minutes. Then you can take the 'JR Bus' bound for Kure Station and get off at 'Kamo Medical Center' bus stop. It takes about 30 minutes. Then you can walk to our school in 7 minutes.

### (2) From Kure Station

You can take the 'JR Bus' bound for Saijo Station and get off at 'Kamo Medical Center' bus stop. It takes about 60 minutes. Then you can walk to our school in 7 minutes.
